#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Welcome back everyone. We hope you had a fun and restful half term and are ready for Term 6—it's going to be a busy one. #### **Bluebells Early Years**

Our Bluebells Early Years Unit at Stoke has been successfully up and running since September. This nurturing Unit is the combination of our Reception and Preschool children who are now taught in a teacher led class environment that is specifically aimed at the Early Years curriculum (Pre-School and Reception).

Having successfully modelled this at Stoke we are delighted to announce that we are recruiting for an Early Years Foundation Stage Teacher at Croscombe (please see our <u>Federation Vacancy</u> page). The new teacher will be responsible for the learning and development of our Reception children. They will help to ensure that the essential early building blocks for academic progress are securely embedded in an intimate and nurturing classroom to ensure that our pupils have every opportunity to 'let their light shine'.

We are incredibly lucky in our Federation to have such amazing staff/pupil ratios which are proven to improve academic achievement as the ability to spend more time with each child allows teachers to get to know their personal strengths and learning styles, ensuring that their individual needs are met. We are confident that by creating a Bluebell class in Croscombe we will be securing the best outcomes for all of our children from the moment they start at our schools.

#### **Playground Projects**

We are sure you will have noticed the new fence that has been put up to screen the playground at Croscombe. It has already significantly reduced the noise pollution from the road and over time we will be adding planting, playground games and display boards to soften and improve the playground experience for the children.

At Stoke our 'build your own bird boxes' have now been delivered and each class will be assembling theirs over the coming weeks. We have also had our wildlife cameras delivered and we are hoping that these will be set up shortly so the children can start studying and learning about the animals we share our school grounds with.

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
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
