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Message from the Governors

Thank you to those of you who attended our second Parent/governor feed back session at Stoke St Michael School. The general feedback was positive however there were suggestions for further improvement. We have discussed these matters with the Co-Headteachers who are working hard with the teaching staff to respond. Response in BLUE.

SENDCO & ELSA: Parents felt that these aspects for the school have improved considerably over the past 12 months and that those parents which SEND children definitely felt better informed and supported.

Homework: Parents felt there was too much inconsistency around the setting and monitoring of homework. There was not set days or set amounts for some classes which confuses both the pupils and parents whilst making it more difficult for parents to establish consistent home work routines. Acorns class was the exception in this case. Thank you for highlighting this. Please see 'Home Learning' paragraph on the front page of this newsletter.

Open Afternoons/Learning Sessions: Parents enquired whether we could plan in some of the sessions we ran previously where parents were invited into the school and did some learning along-side their children to better understand how topics were delivered and to see first hand what their children are doing. When these were run previously parents felt better able to support the children's learning and were able to interact more about what they did at school each day. Yes of course, we will plan these in for the Spring Term.

Pictures of the Pupils Learning: Linked to the previous discussion there was a separate discussion around seeing pictures of what the children are doing more and whether platforms like Tapestry could be used to enable parents to visually see examples of the children and their classroom activities. We also discussed using the website more and including more details in the newsletters. The Governors pointed out that teachers are very focussed currently on delivering and developing the curriculum and they weren't sure they would have the time to update a platform such as Tapestry regularly and there was also challenges with this as some parents don't want pictures of their children shared on platforms. As an alternative we would like to invite you in towards the end of each term to witness your children's learning first hand, we will call this 'Sharing Time' and it will run from 3:00—3:30pm on the date given. You will be able to sit with your child and look through their books and learning displays together. Keep a look out in the Dates for Diary Section. Tapestry will continue to be used in the Early Years. Please also keep a look out on our Website newsfeed for photos. We are currently training staff to be able to update this regularly again.

Communication: Whilst acknowledging that the admin team is current 1 team member short which puts a lot of pressure on the other team members, parents felt that communication from the school needed to be better. The general observations were that sometimes communication about events or trips was sent too late, or that there was not enough information given for parents to fully understand what was being asked of them. We also discussed the need to sometimes better explain the 'why' behind certain decisions such as the lack of swimming and Forest school for years 5 & 6.

Trip letters will be sent out well in advance especially now that we have had the opportunity to train new office staff with processes. We appreciate that a couple of communications this term have been sent with only a four days warning. Forest School is being enhanced in the younger years and replaced by further extra curricular activities in the older years to ensure that the Upper Key Stage Two children are able to gain a greater depth to their Curriculum to prepare them for life at Secondary. We are however working on finding a way to give Y5/6 forest school experience moving forward as we appreciate this is a loved and important activity.

Self Esteem: Parents have fed back that our children performing at Wells Cathedral, stood out above all demonstrating Emerald Power confidence when they spoke to the audience; pride when they sang so loudly and beautifully and excellent behaviour.
