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

### Head lice

There has been cases of head lice in both schools.

We ask you as the parent/guardian to please check and monitor your child's head. The following information is provided for you about head lice. They can spread from one student to another by sharing combs, brushes, clothing, hats and in bedding. Head lice can happen to anyone. It is not a sign of poor health habits or being dirty. There are many lice treatment shampoos on the market as well as other mechanical and manual methods of controlling the lice. Nits (lice eggs) are tiny, white, pearly eggs that attach themselves to the hair shaft close to the scalp. The nit can be removed manually by



pinching between two fingernails and pulling it off the hair shaft, or by using a "nit comb", available in most pharmacies. All members of the household need to be checked when there is one case of head lice in your immediate family.


