

<u>Acorns Class</u> – We have had a delivery of Kapla on a trial! It is an amazing wooden construction kit comprising of 1000 blocks which can be used to make an assortment of structures. It has a unique ratio of 1:3:5 and when placed on top of each other, gravity and balance holds the pieces in place. If the children enjoy (and the whole school will be able to use it) we are hoping FOCS would be kind enough to fund its purchase.

On the subject of design and building, we have been looking at Titanic and the disaster that happened in 1912. There was a lot of discussion in class about how and why it happened, and facts were then written down.
